Dee started her comedy career performing sketches with the **Cambridge Footlights** and wrote the prestigious **Footlights Pantomime** in 2018.

Dee has been nominated for **Best Newcomer** at the **Chortle Awards**, placed as runner up in the **Leicester Square Theatre New Comedian of the Year Award 2021**, won the **2Northdown New Act Competition 2021** and was a finalist in the **2022 BBC New Comedy Award** competition.

Dee took her debut solo stand up show, **Deadname**, to the **Edinburgh Fringe Festival** in 2024 to wide critical acclaim, receiving reviews such as: *"A story of gender identity told with panache, charm, self-deprecation and copious wit...an inventive, casually ironic storytelling skill...a true stand-up."* **★★★★ The Times**. Aisling Bea is a BAFTA award-winning comedian, actor, writer and producer.

As a comedian, Aisling has appeared on shows like **QI**, **Taskmaster**, **Ru Paul's Drag Race** as a judge, **8 Out of 10 Cats Does Countdown**, **A League of Their Own**, **The Big Fat Quiz of Everything**, **Late Night Lycett**, **The Last Leg**, **Live At The Apollo**, **Russell Howard's Good News**, **The Jonathan Ross Show** and **The Graham Norton Show**. She recently appeared as a contestant on **LOL: Last One Laughing Ireland**, for Amazon Prime. In 2011, she became the first woman in 20 years to win the prestigious **So You Think You're Funny?** competition for new stand-ups and in 2016 became the first ever female team captain of long-running panel show **8 Out Of 10 Cats**.

She won a **British Comedy Award** for **Best Female Comedian** and has a mini Stand Up Special as part of Netflix's **The Comedy Line Up**, available to stream globally. Aisling recently announced dates for a 2026 tour in the UK and Ireland.

Her brilliant 5-star series **This Way Up** that she wrote, produced and starred in aired on Channel 4 in the UK and on HULU in the US, earning Aisling the **BAFTA TV Craft Award** for **Breakthrough Talent**. Aisling has been seen as the lead in the blockbuster film based on the music of Take That, **Greatest Days** and in Sky romcom **Smothered**. Most recently, she's been seen opposite Domhnall Gleeson in new romantic drama **Alice & Jack** for Channel 4 and dark comedy feature **& Mrs** opposite Colin Hanks and Billie Lourd. Aisling can now be seen in the second series of Romesh Ranganathan's popular BBC One series **Avoidance**.

Aisling has had lead roles in Netflix Original series, **Living with Yourself** opposite Paul Rudd, Netflix feature film **Love Wedding Repeat**, Nick Frost's 2024 British comedy horror, **Get Away**, James Graham's multi-award winning TV adaptation of his Olivier-winning stage show **Quiz**, the hugely popular Disney remake of Home Alone, **Home Sweet Home Alone** and the New Years Eve Special of **Doctor Who**.

Jimmy Carr

Jimmy Carr is an award-winning comedian, writer, television host, and one of the biggest names in comedy.

Jimmy performs stand-up to sell-out crowds across the globe, bringing his shows to venues in over 50 countries. His most recent tour show, **Terribly Funny**, sold well over 1.2 million tickets globally, including in the USA, Canada, Europe, Asia, Australia, New Zealand and South Africa – making it the biggest ever international stand-up comedy tour. Jimmy's new tour **Jimmy Carr: Laughs Funny** is currently on sale with dates up until May 2026. This includes Jimmy's first tour of arenas across the UK and Ireland.

Jimmy is a household name in UK television, known for hosting over two decades of Channel 4's **8 Out Of 10 Cats**, **8 Out Of 10 Cats Does Countdown** and **Big Fat Quiz**. Jimmy hosted several series of **Comedy Central's Roast Battle UK**, **I Literally Just Told You** and **Your Face Or Mine**. He is a regular on all the top panel shows, including **QI** and **A League of Their Own**, has performed as part of **The Royal Variety Performance** three times, and was a judge on all series of BBC1 entertainment series **I Can See Your Voice**. Most recently, Jimmy hosted the first UK series of **Last One Laughing**, which has been a viral hit for Amazon and is in production on series 2. He is also in production on a new Comedy Central panel show, **Am I The A**hole?**

Jimmy is also a high-profile name in North America. He was the first UK comedian to sign a stand-up deal with streaming behemoth Netflix in 2015, releasing four specials on the platform: **Funny Business** (2016), **Best of Ultimate Gold Greatest Hits** (2017), **His Dark Material** (2021) and **Natural Born Killer** (2024). He also presented and executive produced an original panel show format for Netflix, **The Fix**, and has been a guest multiple times on US staples such **The Tonight Show**, **The Late Late Show** and **Late Night With Conan O'Brien**. He has performed at the **Montreal Just For Laughs Comedy Festival** since 2003, with more appearances than any other UK act in that time.

Before making the move to streaming, Jimmy was one of the bestselling acts in the comedy DVD market. His eight titles (**Live, Stand-Up, Comedian, In Concert, Telling Jokes, Making People Laugh, Being Funny** and **Laughing & Joking**) selling over 1.2 million copies between them. These shows are now all available on Jimmy's YouTube channel, where he has accrued **over 1 million subscribers** since launching in 2018. In 2024, Jimmy began releasing brand-new original content from his live shows under the name **Heckle Amnesty** - crowd work content that shows off Jimmy's world-class ability at dealing with hecklers. To date across all major social media platforms the videos have generated over 600 million views.

You can also hear Jimmy on many hit podcasts, including **Diary of a CEO**, **Modern Wisdom** and **The Joe Rogan Experience**.

Jimmy is also a published author. He co-wrote **The Naked Jape: Uncovering the Hidden World of Jokes** in 2007 and his highly anticipated memoir **Before & Laughter**, was released in September 2021, making The Sunday Times Bestsellers list.

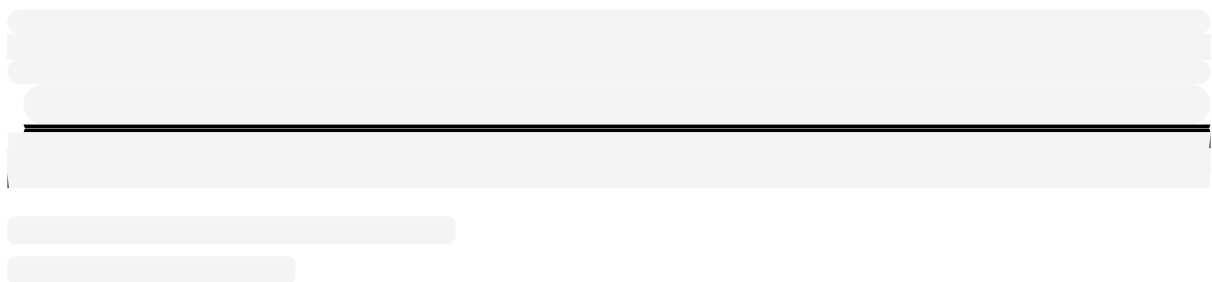

Against tradition they left New Zealand's summer to go to the northern hemisphere's winter and were shocked by the snow when they stepped off the plane in t-shirts and jandals. The HBO executives liked their act and asked them to film a half hour performance for a stand-up comedy show called **One Night Stand**.

Over the next four years they made a TV pilot, a sitcom, released an EP (**The Distant Future**) and a full length album (self-titled LP), toured North America, made a sandwich, filmed a second season of the sitcom, toured North America again, released a second album (**I Told You I Was Freaky**), and went back to New Zealand.

The HBO sitcom became a hit. This, along with the praise for the subsequent album releases (on Sub Pop Records) and the duo's live show, was the comedic hat trick that catapulted Flight of the Conchords to international sensations.

The Conchords would also see major success individually. Jemaine lent his voice to the character Nigel the cockatoo in the **Rio** films (2011 and 2014). He was cast as "Boris The Animal" in **Men in Black 3** (2012). Jemaine also wrote, produced and starred in a variety of projects including the acclaimed Vampire comedy film, **What We Do In the Shadows**, and **People Places Things**. More recently, he joined the cast of **The BFG**, the Steven Spielberg adaptation of the Roald Dahl book, as the giant named Fleshlumpeater.

Bret has also been hard at work writing and acting for various television and film projects. Most notably **The Muppets** (2011) and **Muppets Most Wanted** (2014), the former of which won him an Academy Award for "Best Original Song" for the power ballad "Man or Muppet". In 2012 he starred in the New Zealand black comedy **Two Little Boys** and then in 2013 he was cast in Jerusha Hess's romantic comedy **Austenland**. He is currently writing the screenplay and songs for a film adaptation of Neil Gaiman's book **Fortunately the Milk** as well as penning tunes for the upcoming

Disney film **Bob the Musical**.

And somehow, between all of the film and TV work, the Conchords managed to co-headline the “Oddball Comedy & Curiosity Festival” alongside Dave Chappelle in 2013.

In 2016, Jemaine and Bret announced the wildly successful **The Flight of the Conchords sing Flight of the Conchords Tour**. The duo premiered new material alongside fan favorites, and quickly sold out amphitheatres and concert halls across the U.S. Also that year, the duo headlined Tenacious D’s Festival Supreme in Los Angeles. The tour came to the UK and Ireland in 2018, their first UK shows in seven years. The tour sold out arenas countrywide and ended with a four-night run at London’s Eventim Apollo in Hammersmith, one of which was filmed and released as special on HBO, entitled **Flight Of The Conchords: Live In London**.

Stuart is also a talented interviewer and host of the internationally renowned **Comedian's Comedian** podcast. He has interviewed many of the comedy world's household names, including Jimmy Carr, James Acaster, Bo Burnham, Sarah Millican, Ronny Chieng and Bill Burr. Her previous tour show, **Bobby Dazzler**, was seen by more than 300,000 people in sixteen countries.

Sarah has embarked on numerous sell-out tours in the UK and beyond. Her first 3 Edinburgh fringe runs, **Sarah Millican's Not Nice**, **Sarah Millican: Typical Woman** and **Chatterbox** were critically acclaimed with the latter earning a nomination for the **Foster's Edinburgh Comedy Award**. When she took **Chatterbox** on her first national tour, it completely sold out. Her second tour, **Thoroughly Modern Millican**, sold over 190,000 tickets, including 13 sold out nights at the Newcastle Tyne Theatre. Sarah's fifth tour, **Control Enthusiast**, also sold out its performances across the UK and Ireland in 2019, before heading out internationally in 2019.
