Nabil Abdulrashid is an award-winning comedian and writer.

Nabil has appeared on all of the top comedy entertainment shows, including multiple appearances on: Live at the Apollo, QI, Have I Got News For You, The Last Leg and Would I Lie To You? plus House of Games, An Extra Slice, Pointless Celebrities, 8 Out of 10 Cats Does Countdown and loads more. A practising Muslim, Nabil was also a 'pilgrim' on BBC Two's faith-based show Pilgrimage. He has come a long way since being a finalist and Alesha Dixon's golden buzzer on Britain's Got Talent in 2020.

Nabil received critical acclaim and sell out audiences for his debut **Edinburgh Fringe** show **The Purple Pill,** which he then took on tour. The show was filmed as a stand up Special and is available to watch on YouTube. His new show **Urban Battuta** has been on tour across the UK, Europe and beyond.
