Profile

Joe Lycett is an award-winning comedian, writer, artist and television host.

A hugely successful and acclaimed stand up comedian, Joe has extensively toured across the UK and internationally. He has produced 3 specials from his sell out international tours: That's The Way, A-Ha A-Ha, Joe Lycett (2016); I'm About To Lose Control And I Think Joe Lycett (2018) and More, More, More! How Do You Lycett? How Do You Lycett? (2023). His most recent show took in arenas and theatres across the UK and Ireland in 2022, followed by an Australian and New Zealand leg in early 2023. In total, the tour was seen live by over 200,000 people.

Joe is an award-winning and highly regarded TV host; his work has won him two BAFTAs, two Royal Television Society Awards plus Rose D'or and Grierson nominations. Most recently, Joe presented a new Sky series, Joe Lycett's United States of Birmingham (Sky), which followed him uniting eighteen Birminghams across North America. Joe hosted several series of his own live TV show Late Night Lycett (C4) in his hometown of Birmingham. He fronted his own comedy consumer affairs show Joe Lycett's Got Your Back (C4) and is also the host of Channel 4's long-running travel documentary series, Travel Man. He hosted several series of The Great British Sewing Bee (BBC), presented Joe Lycett: Summer Exhibitionist as part of the BBC's coverage of the Royal Academy Summer Exhibition in 2022 as well as hosting Channel 4's Joe Lycett's Big Pride Party.

Joe's special Joe Lycett vs The Oil Giant was nominated for a Grierson Award. In 2022, Channel 4 aired a Joe Lycett vs David Beckham: Got Your Back at Xmas, which won a BAFTA and a Broadcast Award. 2024 saw Joe take on sewage companies in Joe Lycett vs Sewage. He has also won two Royal Television Society awards, a nomination for Foster's Edinburgh Comedy Award for Best Newcomer (2012). At the National Comedy Awards in 2023, he won the Comedy Game Changer Award and was nominated for Outstanding Male Comedy Entertainment Performance.

Joe has appeared on all of the top comedy entertainment shows including: QI (BBC), 8 Out of 10 Cats Does Countdown (C4), Taskmaster (Dave/C4), Live At The Apollo (BBC), Michael McIntyre's Big Show (BBC), Sunday Night at the Palladium (ITV), The Graham Norton Show (BBC), Who Do You Think You Are (BBC), Have I Got News For You (BBC), The Big Fat Quiz of The Year (C4) and The Last Leg (C4).

His work as an artist has been featured in the Royal Academy, Manchester Art Gallery, IKON, Birmingham Midlands Arts Centre and Wolverhampton Art Gallery. His portrait of Harry Styles was famously sold to Harry himself for £6 and a KitKat Chunky Peanut Butter.

Joe has released three books Parsnips: Buttered, a self-help book designed to teach you how to "baffle, bamboozle and boycott your way through modern life", released in October 2016. He also released a limited edition book in 2023 called Bins, an ode to bins of all shapes and sizes, to raise funds for Queens Heath Pride in Birmingham. All online copies sold out within an hour of going on sale. Joe's third book, Joe Lycett's Art Hole, which explores his portraits and the scandalous stories behind them, was released in September 2024.

He has also directed music videos for rising music stars Litany and Katy J Pearson, whilst he has written, directed and produced a series of short films, Ray and Linda, the former of which toured film festivals around the world.
