David O'Doherty is an award-winning comedian, author, podcast host and musician.

David is currently touring his newest show **Highway to the David Zone** around the UK and Ireland, which will soon begin it's **Edinburgh Fringe Festival** run. It will be his 22nd solo show at the festival. Having been nominated for best newcomer in 2000, for his show **The Story of the Boy Who Saved Comedy**, David went on to win the main **Edinburgh Comedy Award** in 2008 for **Let's Comedy**. David has returned to the festival every year since, receiving widespread recognition and cementing his reputation as one of the most consistently funny performers at the Fringe. David has also performed stand-up around the world at festivals in Melbourne, Montreal, New York, Prague, Adelaide, Iceland and Wellington.

A TV regular, David made his stand-up debut on BBC2's Live At The Apollo in 2017. David's other television appearances include Travel Man, 8 Out Of 10 Cats Does Countdown, Would I Lie To You?, Celebrity Mastermind, Richard Osman's House of Games, The Great Celebrity Bake Off and The Alternative Comedy Experience. He has hosted Never Mind The Buzzcocks and made appearances on shows such as QI, Dave's One Night Stand and Have I Got News For You. During lockdown, David appeared in Reasons To Be Cheerful With Matt Lucas. He also hosted his own series on Channel 4, Along For The Ride With David O'Doherty interviewing well-known faces on cycle trips.

In 2024, David launched the hit podcast **What Did You Do Yesterday?**, alongside co-host Max Rushden, where they find out what their guests did yesterday.

David is also a successful author and has written a series of critically acclaimed and award-winning children's books: Ronan Long Gets It Wrong; the "wonderfully daft" 100 Facts About Pandas and 100 Facts About Sharks (written in conjunction with Mike Ahern and Claudia O'Doherty); and the Danger Is Everywhere series. His most recent book for children, The Summer I Robbed a Bank, won Irish Children's Book of the Year and has been adapted for the stage by his brother Mark. It debuted at The Everyman, Cork in June 2024
